
"Big Bore" 39 PICT for an Upright Engine

My Bus 2 has a mild 1904 stroker with the CB 2280 "Cheater Cam" in it but is considerably restricted with the stock 34PICT Solex carb. It's not a HP monster by any stretch but it gets along much better than the anemic factory 1500 would. It has a stock muffler with the baffles cut out to decrease backpressure and increase flow. I go on long distance camping trips with it regularly that are over a thousand miles each, we stay on back roads for the most part but occasionally I will take a trip on an interstate. When I do, I hold my speed down to about 62mph to keep the engine and everything else happy. It's equipped with a big nut trans running 4.12 ring and pinion and 1.26 reduction box gears. Factory would have been a 4.37 and 1.26 so it's slightly taller. Tires and wheels are stock and it has disc brakes up front.

I read chatter on Samba about a 39PICT so I thought I'd give it a shot, I know Ebay would refund my money if I wasn't happy. For those not fluent in carbs, that means the venturi on the 39PICT is 5mm (almost 1/4") larger than the stock 34PICT, which flows much more air. I bought this and installed it to replace the 34PICT and it works great, and gives at least 5+ HP, enough to feel. I'm really surprised at how well it runs, the only minor modification was the fuel inlet was setup for 1/4" hose rather than the 5.5mm that VW uses. It is a no-name Chinese unit with nothing cast into the carb at all.

It's basically a direct bolt-on replacement; most of the adjustments had to be tinkered with, which is expected. It comes with a bunch of different size jets, I thought a 138 would be a good place to start so I pulled the main jet and it had a 138 in it out of the box. The stock 34PICT used a 127 from the factory. I've only put about 50 miles on it, but the 1904 loves it! If you're looking for a few cheap horsepower, this might be a good option for you. It's only \$105 plus shipping and also available on Amazon.

Winter's here, time to start thinking about what projects you want to get done during the salt season. I'm probably going to change the sloppy pitman bushings in the steering box in Bus 2 and maybe do the kingpins and linkpins. Bus 1 doesn't need anything I can think of so it will probably stay in hibernation. Stay warm and keep active! We're planning a camping trip to western PA in August 2023, you're all invited to accompany us if you like, Tentatively it will be the Allegheny National Forest, Kinzua Bridge skywalk, Oil City and other neat destinations. 
